

MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT & CEO

Better Health Partnership, the Northeast Ohio regional health improvement collaborative, prides itself on identifying and implementing best practices across organizations to achieve positive, sustainable change in health and health equity. We partner with health systems, social care coordination agencies (CCAs), public health departments, payers, and others to achieve improved outcomes for adults and children with chronic disease, behavioral health, and social needs.

In February 2020, with support from the Ohio Commission on Minority Health (OCMH) and local philanthropy, Better Health launched a Pathways Community HUB (PCH). This evidence-based best practice model provides a reimbursable, sustainable care coordination infrastructure in Cuyahoga County to help its most vulnerable residents. Our CCAs, and the community health workers (CHWs) they employ, have helped connect **more than 2,400** individuals to necessary care and resources for needs related to food access, stable housing, utility maintenance, transportation to medical appointments and more.

Recently, the state of Ohio's 2024-2025 biennial budget included a provision that created and funded the Ohio Center for Community Health Worker Excellence. This funding will enhance and strengthen the CHW workforce, which continues to be in high demand, and appropriated \$2.5 million each year of the biennium. In addition, our partners helped secure a \$3 million Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) grant to support CHWs pursuing certification from the Ohio Board of Nursing and to build capacity in Northeast Ohio. We could not be prouder of our CHWs who bring knowledge and skills, as well as their full hearts to work every day – impacting thousands of lives across the region!



Our care coordination agencies, and the community health workers they employ, have connected MORE THAN 2,400 individuals in Cuyahoga County to necessary care and resources for needs related to food access, stable housing, utility maintenance, transportation to medical appointments and more.





Improving Birth Outcomes: Maternal / Infant Health

CHW Helps HUB Refugee Client Plan for Birth

Aleatha, Beech Brook's CHW and Health and Wellness Coordinator worked with a pregnant client shortly before the birth of her baby. The client, a refugee and full-time nursing student, needed to secure a car seat and develop a plan for childcare in case her mother's visa wasn't approved before the baby arrived. Aleatha offered emotional support, connected her to Starting Point to identify potential childcare providers, and secured a car seat. Despite running into many barriers, Aleatha's persistence and knowledge of community resources paid off. She has continued to work with the family to resolve issues arising from language barriers, navigate insurance plans, access food assistance and receive utilities support. Today, the client is still actively pursuing her nursing degree and the family has achieved stability!











Medicaid Managed Care Reimbursements Paid to Agency Partners



Managed care organization (MCO) reimbursements to our agency partners helps them grow their capacity to serve the community and is <u>sustainable revenue</u> for outcomes achieved by CHWs with their clients.

Year-over-year growth in reimbursements returned to care coordination agencies has increased from \$51,000 (2020) to a projection of more than \$404,000 (2023); including a **70%** increase from 2022 to 2023.

Community health workers (CHWs) are the heart of the HUB model and the reason for its success. Without CHWs, the model cannot deliver results.

In addition to the Better Health Pathways HUB team convening monthly meetings for its 40+ CHW network, we are a key partner with MetroHealth and others, participating in and contributing to a new Community Health Worker Capacity Building Collaborative. This Collaborative aims to increase the number of front-line CHW public health professionals - the link between health and social services providers in Northeast Ohio.

This 3-year project, supported with nearly \$3 million in federal Health Resouces and Services Administration (HRSA) funding, is part of a nationwide effort to build the pipeline of CHWs to increase access to care, improve public health emergency response and address the public health needs of underserved communities.

The Pathways HUB team will also play an active role in the Ohio Center for CHW Excellence, along with 11 other Ohio HUBs, sharing and learning how to apply best practices.



Marketing CHW Career Opportunities

In 2023, the HUB marketing and communications team began promoting agency CHW job openings by sharing opportunities on Better Health Partnership and Pathways HUB social media platforms. In addition, *The Land*, a local, nonprofit publication, attended the 2023 CHW Day event and wrote an article that shared insights about the CHW role, job responsibilities and requirements.



BHP Collaborative Champion Recognized



Marquita Rockamore, Director, Health Industry Solutions in the Manufacturing Technology Center at Tri-C, Corporate College, was recognized as a Better Health Partnership Collaborative Champion for going above and beyond to support CHWs and the advancement of the Better Health Pathways HUB!

Exceptional contributions include:

- Spearheaded the first annual CHW National Recognition Day in 2022
- Established Tri-C as a care coordination agency to assist students with social needs and improve academic achievement
- Serves on the Better Health Pathways HUB Community Advisory Board
- Co-leads the NEO CHW Capacity Building Collaborative Advisory Board

Child Abuse and Neglect Training



The Pathways HUB team invited CHWs to attend the 2023 Better Health Partnership Learning Collaborative to learn about mental health and participate in a special session delivered by Illinois C. Wilson III, MPA, Supervisor, Cuyahoga County Division of Children and Family Services, focused on child abuse and neglect. CHWs developed skills to keep children safe from child abuse and neglect by learning about the role and responsibilities of the Cuyahoga County Division of Children and Family Services, how to make and track referrals, statute requirements, and the importance of developing a working relationship or partnership with clients.



Motivational Interviewing

The HUB team organized a session for CHWs on motivational interviewing. Led by Louis Guardiola Jr., M.S.W., this training enhanced CHW skills for engaging in meaningful conversations and developing better client relationships to lead, ultimately, to better outcomes. CHWs learned strategies for building rapport and understanding client motivations, while fostering a non-judgmental and supportive environment.

Free training to become a community health worker is available. Here's what CHWs do, what it pays, and how to become one

"Be the Change"

To honor Community Health Worker Day, Better Health Partnership, Cleveland State University (CSU) and Cuyahoga Community College hosted a celebratory event on Tuesday, June 6 at CSU's Student Center. More than 150 CHWs, vendors, and other representatives attended the event to recognize and appreciate the valuable role CHWs perform working one-on-one with people in underserved communities to help them navigate the healthcare system, social service sector, and connect with available resources.

Several speakers and a passionate, inspiring panel of CHWs shared their path to becoming a CHW and remarkable stories of client lives they've impacted. The panel included representatives from Birthing Beautiful Communities, Carmella Rose Health Foundation, the Cleveland Department of Public Health, the MetroHealth System, and Spry Senior. More than 20 social service agencies and MCOs provided an opportunity for individuals to network and learn about the many services they offer to support the work and professional development of CHWs.





A study to understand the impact of connecting pregnant people to fresh, nutritious food during their pregnancy and postpartum. Currently only available to Better Health Pathways HUB participants (Medicaid eligible). A few noteworthy accomplishments:

- 742 boxes of food have been delivered to 21 pregnant clients
- \$5,010 in cash assistance has been provided to
 20 pregnant clients to purchase their own food
- 22 babies have been born since the study started

Addressing Health Care Gaps





The HUB team and CareSource have partnered on a well care pilot to improve rates of CareSource members obtaining recommended breast cancer and diabetes screenings. The HUB team evaluates CareSource data to identify members missing one or more screenings and informs CHWs about clients in need of preventive services. The CHW follows the Pathways Community HUB (PCH) model, including the Medical Referral and Education / Learning pathways, to schedule client medical appointments and address barriers to care.
