

Improving youth wellness

BHP Children's Health Collaborative seeks to influence new ways to approach youth wellness to improve holistic health outcomes and academic performance for children. Spear-headed by Better Health's Children's Health Leadership Team and subcommittees, our collaborative consists of cross-sector stakeholders in Northeast Ohio who share purpose and goals for children's health improvement from primary care, behavioral health, academia, social services, public health, payers, and more.




We believe that shifting from fragmented access and strategies for well care to a fully integrated systems-approach will help mitigate rising obesity, behavioral health conditions and suicide rates, costly asthma exacerbations, low immunization, lead testing rates, and school absenteeism. This approach also creates a "no wrong door", 365 days a year entry to access help for children with physical, behavioral, environmental, and social health needs. Implementation of universal screening, and access to effective data integration and activation systems that promote bi-directional communication and referrals, along with the collection of relevant data to measure outcomes, are key objectives of the collaborative and necessary for successful transformation.

Tackling Persistent Disparities With Adult Chronic Disease

Better Health Partnership's Adult Health Leadership team, consisting of northeast Ohio health system clinical experts and population health leaders, has selected three priority areas of focus to collectively reduce persistent racial/ethnic and income disparities in adult chronic disease.

Informed by clinical and other relevant data, the team seeks to identify and spread best practices with strategies and interventions related to:

- 1) Community engagement with health systems
- 2) Integrated behavioral health with primary care
- 3) Social need referrals and follow-up

Leaders from Northeast Ohio federally qualified health centers (FQHCs) formed the FQHC COVID Collaborative in 2020 and engaged Better Health Partnership (BHP) to implement a comprehensive, coordinated and equitable response to COVID-19




